A bone fracture is usually treated with a cast and/or splint. A cast or splint will immobilize the bone (keep it from moving) in order to encourage the bones to align (straighten) and to prevent use of the bone. Coding for Closed Treatment of Fractures - AAOS The two keys to understanding the appropriate coding for closed treatment of fractures is to first determine whether the physician provides "restorative treatment" of the fracture; second, determine whether the same physician will be providing all the follow-up care within the 90-day global period.
